

99 YEARS OLD AND STILL INSPIRED BY GUPPIES...

FISHING around for some nugget of knowledge to cast before you this morning, I chanced upon a paper in the latest issue of the journal *Animal Behaviour* which detailed some intriguing observations on the mating habits of guppies.

The title of the paper is "Male guppies change courtship behaviour in response to their own quality relative to that of a rival male" and it reports the results of an experiment to see what a male guppy does when his woman is approached by another male.

"We show here," they report, "that male guppies abandon their approach to a female only when the rival male is phenotypically superior," or, to put it more simply, the poor bloke gives up if another better-looking bloke turns up. Yet it's not quite as simple as that makes it sound.

It has long been known that female guppies prefer brightly coloured males but the research found that: "Both natural and artificially induced brightly coloured males continue to approach a female when the rival was brightly coloured, but both natural and induced dull-coloured males abandoned their approach to a female when the rival was brightly coloured."

So not only will a drab male give up in the face of a gaudy rival but a gaudy male in drab clothing will also give up. And that remains true even if the apparently gaudy rival is not gaudy at all but is a drab fish in bright disguise.

As I said at the start, I was fishing around for something like this, so I hailed a passing male guppy and asked what he thought of the research.

"Well it stands to reason, don't it?" he said. "I mean if the girls go for flashy types, there's not much sense in trying to chat them up if there's a gaudy rival around."

"Even a drab rival in designer clothing will probably fool the average girl. They're not very bright you know, and they're really superficial when it comes to choosing blokes. One spray-on tan and they're anyone's, if you get my drift."

Just as he had finished saying that, a female guppy swam past and said, "Oi, who are you calling stupid? It makes sense going for brightly coloured men. Not only are they better breeding prospects but it's nice to see a chap who cares about his appearance."

"A fish like that knows how to give a girl a good time. Anyway, a girl gets a bad reputation if she's seen flirting with guys who look like they've just swum out of a sewer."

WAIVER: You can get insurance before you go

Car hire hell can break the bank

IF YOU plan to hire a car for your summer holiday, beware of hidden rip-offs that can drive up the total cost.

British holidaymakers forked out a staggering £475million on extra car hire charges last year, according to holiday comparison site TravelSupermarket.com.

More than half have been overcharged on car rental, with one in five saying they never hire a car abroad now as a result.

Common car hire cons include hefty charges for failing to return the car with the right amount of fuel, averaging more

than £97. Those who exceed their agreed mileage pay almost £168 on average.

Car extras can be shockingly expensive with sat nav costs averaging £85, additional drivers costing £132 and child seats a whopping £159.

Motorists typically pay a £169 excess damage waiver fee, which covers the cost of any damages to the vehicle and yet you can buy a standalone multi-trip policy for a fraction of the price.

Bob Atkinson, travel expert at TravelSupermarket.com, said: "Car hire

is a wonderful way to get the most out of your holiday but our research clearly shows some car hire firms are putting Britons off with their hard-sell tactics."

He also advised to book vehicles in advance online rather than rent in the resort: "Do not be misled by the headline price. Work out how all the extras add up and whether you really need them."

Many airlines will carry your child car seat for free, for example, while you can also avoid additional driver costs if just one of you gets behind the wheel.

The heat's on so make the switch

HOME energy costs are rising once again, as utility companies scrap their cheapest fixed-rate tariffs.

Gas and electricity suppliers are taking advantage of post-Brexit political uncertainty to hike charges in the hope that distracted householders fail to notice.

This has increased the cost of a fixed tariff by up to £105 a year, squeezing household budgets, according to new research by uSwitch.com.

An astonishing 15 energy suppliers have dumped their cheapest fixed-rate deals in the last month alone and replaced them with a range of more expensive plans.

It follows a rise in wholesale energy costs, which recently hit a nine-month high, according to latest figures from ICIS, the independent authority on energy market pricing.

The big energy suppliers generated plenty of anger by

passing on only small price cuts when wholesale oil and gas prices crashed back in 2014 and 2015.

Yet today they are falling over themselves to take advantage of the first opportunity to ramp up prices.

Extra Energy has dumped its cheapest tariff and now charges £105 more, while Sainsbury's Energy charges £94 more. OVO Energy and First Utility have increased their prices by £63 and £48 respectively.

Fears of supply shortages and the higher cost of energy imports following the fall in sterling are also adding to the pressure.

Energy charges may continue

to rise and households worried about rising costs have been urged to switch to a fixed rate energy deal to help protect themselves against future price hikes.

Some suppliers still offer tariffs charging as much as £315 a year less than the average variable tariff from one of the "big six" suppliers: E.On British Gas, EDF Energy, Npower, ScottishPower and SSE.

Avro Energy's fixed Simple and Summer tariff is the cheapest costing £747 a year on average, uSwitch's figures show.

It is followed by GB Energy's variable rate Premium Energy Saver at £765 and So Energy's fixed rate So Emu plan at £766.

Npower is the only one of the

big six with a top 10 plan – its newly-launched Online Price Fix August 2017 in ninth place costing £786 a year.

For those who want to fix for longer, First Utility's new FU First Fixed June 2019 v2 plus charges £999 a year for three years. However, this plan has a £60 exit fee.

Tom Lyon, energy expert at uSwitch, said: "There are still some very competitive deals on the market, offering significant savings against the average big six standard variable plan."

He said consumers who are concerned about rising energy costs should shop around and consider switching to a fixed-term tariff, offering protection against future price hikes.

Ben Wilson, spokesperson at GoCompare.com Energy, said that half of those who switch save almost £300: "Spending a few minutes comparing the tariffs available can certainly be time well spent."



How to make annuities pay after Brexit

RETIREES who are postponing buying an annuity in the wake of Brexit have been warned that the delay could cost them thousands of pounds.

Annuity rates have plunged since the financial crisis and dipped again in the wake of EU referendum uncertainty.

Many retirees may decide to postpone their decision in the hope that rates recover, or because they will get more income when they are older and their life expectancy is lower.

However, new figures suggest this may be a false economy that may cost you in the longer run.

ANNUITIES LIVE

Despite the numerous reports, the death of the annuity has been exaggerated.

When Chancellor George Osborne gave the over-55s the right to cash in their pension pots from April last year, many thought he had signed the death warrant for the restrictive annuity.

An annuity is an income for life that you buy to fund your retirement. Once you buy one, you are locked in for good.

Sales slumped when the Chancellor announced he was giving older people the flexibility to spend their pension as they wished, but they have picked up.

Around 20,000 people now buy an annuity every quarter, according to figures from the Association of British Insurers. This is roughly the same number as sign up for income drawdown, a more flexible option where you leave your nest egg invested and draw income as you need it.

Buying an annuity is one of the biggest financial decisions you will ever make and it has got even more complicated in recent years, so do your sums carefully.

FALLING RATES

Annuity rates have plunged by more than 37 per cent since the financial crisis, according to new figures from IFA Hargreaves Lansdown, hammering their popularity.

The trend has accelerated with rates down 3.5 per cent since the referendum, with 14 annuity companies cutting returns.

In July 2008, a 65-year old with £100,000 could buy level income of £7,855 a year, but today they would get just £4,975, which is £2,880 less. A couple would get just £4,514 from a joint life annuity.

These starting incomes would fall to just £3,336 and £2,994 respectively if you bought an annuity that paid an extra three per cent each year to keep up with the rising cost of living.

Tom McPhail, head of retirement policy at Hargreaves Lansdown, says it is not all bad news, as the stock market recovery since the financial crisis means the average £100,000 pension pot has risen 58.9 per cent and is worth £158,960 today.

HISTORIC LOWS

The FTSE 100 has risen strongly following the initial Brexit shock,

and is now trading at an 11-month high, putting more money into people's pension pots.

However, annuity rates are less likely to recover as bond yields fall to new lows and the Bank of England considers cutting interest rates.

McPhail says: "Even though rates are now at historic lows there is no certainty they will recover any time soon."

There is one big advantage to buying an annuity today: it means you start receiving your income immediately.

An investor with £100,000 who bought an annuity paying £7,855 a year in July 2008 would have banked total income of £62,840 up to today.

If they had decided against buying an annuity and kept their money invested in the average balanced managed pension fund it would have risen in value and be worth £158,960 today.

This could buy them a higher income of £10,138 today at age 73 - £2,283 a year more than in 2008 - but they would have to live to 100 to catch up on lost income from the last eight years.

Whether to delay is a complex calculation, so you cannot expect to get it spot on. McPhail suggests you hedge your bets with a "mix and match strategy", splitting your pension between an annuity and drawdown.

Andrew Tully, pensions technical director at Retirement Advantage, says whatever your decision, you should shop around for an annuity on the open market to get the best rate.

"If you have health problems, or drink or smoke heavily, you could get more from an 'enhanced'

or 'impaired life' annuity, which may pay up to 20 per cent more income as your life expectancy is lower."

RIGHT DECISION

Patrick Connolly, certified financial planner at Chase de Vere, says that despite falling rates, an annuity is still the right choice for somebody who needs a guaranteed income to last the rest of their lives.

"Everybody should have secure income to cover their basic living costs in retirement as the state pension is unlikely to be enough on its own.

He adds: You need to forget that annuity rates were higher in the past and accept that we are living in a low interest rate environment and this looks likely to continue for some time to come."

The major argument against buying an annuity is that you may be locking in to what you think is an unattractive or insufficient level of income and you cannot reverse your decision afterwards.

Connolly says: "There are plans to launch a second-hand annuity market allowing people to sell their existing annuities, but it is unlikely you will get a good deal by doing this."

Those with larger pension pots could spend half on an annuity and keep the other half invested in income drawdown in the hope of benefiting from future stock market growth.

Income drawdown is riskier because the value of your pot will rise and fall in line with markets. Connolly says: "You shouldn't gamble with the income you need to pay bills and living expenses."

Adding strength to defence

SUPER-STRENGTH materials and parts are Permal Gloucester's speciality, putting the manufacturer at the heart of life-saving projects from new bridges to speedy, blast-resistant military vehicles.

The firm has won new defence contracts that will see its armour-lightweight composites that combine fibre and plastic resins - included in the British Army's order for 589 new AJAX reconnaissance and fighting carriers being made by General Dynamics Land Systems.

Permal's £15million, seven-year deal announced last month will secure many jobs within its 75-strong workforce, which has also won the contract to supply protective panels for UK engineering firm Supacat's new HMT Extenda vehicle.

Permal, privately owned by its founders and venture capital house 3i, has boosted its annual turnover to £10million and forecasts a further 50 per cent increase by 2019.

However, the time required from devising a solution and winning a contract to seeing it protect lives on the frontline is not for the fainthearted, says chief executive Dr Colin MacAdam. "We do it by investing heavily in research and development, more than six per cent of turnover, which is relatively high."

"That comes from investors and is also helped by R&D tax credits. There is always pressure on these budgets as they come straight off

the bottom line in the short term, but it is essential as we operate in a very competitive, global market."

To win the AJAX order, Permal bought £300,000 of new machinery to make the materials and installed a £1million heating system, which has cut costs and reduced carbon emissions by 400 tonnes a year.

"Many of our processes - bonding, precision cutting, moulding, spraying and pressing - are energy-intensive. We had to have a new, efficient boiler to improve our capability. Besides our scientists and engineers spend a lot of their time destroying very expensive raw materials," adds chemist MacAdam.

A management buyout in 1998 from a French electrical insulation firm was the making of today's Permal, freeing it of lengthy management chains so it could use its agility to adapt and seize new

opportunities. Its standard products became eclipsed by low-cost, volume makers overseas, so it transformed at a time when the UK was engaging in more conflicts internationally and defence requirements had soared.

Advances in technology, alongside the spread of terrorism and the instabilities triggered by climate change, have also driven the firm's progress as demand for composites continues to grow.

"Weight is increasingly an issue. Composites are lighter and stronger and our goal is to replace metal wherever we can," says MacAdam.

Those developments, coinciding with the reduction in defence budgets, have spurred the firm to increase its markets in aerospace, rail, medical and Formula One. For

Boeing, it devised and tested a patch repair system, should panel liners be damaged in the event of a fire breaking out in an aircraft's cargo bays. Permal now supplies them to all airlines operating Boeing 787s.

A groundbreaking project with Arup could make bridges more resilient to floods and storms. The footbridge, which the engineering consultancy designed and which Permal is prototyping, is made of a glass fibre-reinforced resin that weighs up to 70 per cent less than its conventional steel counterpart and can span 35 metres over rail lines, roads and water courses.

"Bridge-building is set to become a simpler process," predicts sales director and founder Nick Baird.







Young, gifted and back

IN THE back of the satirical magazine Private Eye one advert unfailingly caught my eye. "Dense? Join Densa. The society for stupid people." I'm not sure if there was a real Densa. That's not really the point. The Densa ad justly and smartly took the mickey out of the adverts for Mensa.

More to the point it took the mickey out of Mensa, the society for people with high IQs, and out of every smug, self-congratulating delusional who ever thought about joining it.

Sadly that one's alive and kicking, along with the daft, outmoded views of intelligence it was built on. There's no better evidence for that than the appearance of a fourth series of **CHILD GENIUS (C4)**, in which a Mensa member runs

cohorts of children through the sort of computations that are meant to mean they're intelligent.

To be fair a lot of the young contestants in this brain-game fame show are brilliantly, delightfully bright.

They have enquiring minds, they are motivated to learn things, they see the value of knowledge and they're just plain interested in the world around them. Take Mog, 12,

from Rugby. He's not been hothoused by some nightmare, helicopter parent. His interests include sheep and foreign languages. I expect some people tease him for these interests but I expect some of them have no interest in anything.

There are plenty of adults who are allowed to vote, have families and agree bank loans and trade deals who are not remotely interested in anything either.

On those terms I know who I'd rather be stuck in a boat with. But those qualities of interest, enthusiasm and openness to ideas are not the ones being tested or proven by this TV show.

The various rounds and heats prove nothing, except that the children have done a lot of maths and developed very extensive

memory banks of words and facts. There's also a confused set of motives among the people who make and commission this show.

Sometimes it is urging us to cheer the youngsters on, to care about their losses and celebrate their victories. At other times it is zooming in on their priggishness and the questionable pushiness of (some of) their parents and inviting us to snigger away at them like the school bullies at the back of the bus. It seems to think it can have its cake and eat it, in other words, and even the densest person knows that you can't.

Everyone has a **MY WORST JOB (C4)** story. Mine involves choc ices, a hairnet and eight-hour shifts at a task called bottom-checking (which wasn't remotely what it sounds like). Actually I'm not sure that was

as bad as the job I had in Athens, trying to entice backpackers to stay at a hotel that didn't exist (although another far more horrid one did).

Last night's show was a themed collection of similar anecdotes, generally funnier on the grounds of being delivered by faintly famous funny folk, but not especially original. The odd one out, and very welcome for the 30 seconds or so he got on screen, was the writer Will Self who pointed out that people vanish when they are doing menial jobs.

On becoming a young road sweeper, he recalled, pretty girls no longer glanced at him at all. He then added that he'd got the job thanks to his girlfriend, who was also a road sweeper. So maybe that was exactly what she had in mind.



Popcorn rocky road bars

We're making our favourite USA dessert. No-bake and full of tasty bite-sized bits - kids will love mixing up this sweet treat! Serves 6-8.

INGREDIENTS

- 100g butter, roughly chopped
- 3 tablespoons golden syrup
- 200g milk chocolate, broken into squares
- 200g dark chocolate, broken into squares
- 150g digestive biscuits, broken into chunks
- 80g marshmallows, snipped into bite-sized pieces
- 80g raisins
- 80g cranberries
- 80g toffee popcorn plus extra to decorate

METHOD

- 1) Gently melt the butter and syrup in a pan over a low heat. Remove from the heat and tip in the chocolate pieces, stirring to melt them. When you have a smooth melted mixture, tip into a large bowl.
- 2) Stir in the biscuits, marshmallows, raisins, cranberries and popcorn into the chocolate mixture until well-coated, then pour into a 17cm square tin lined with greaseproof paper, spread the mixture out until roughly level and fairly compact, then press some extra popcorn pieces into the top to decorate. Chill until hard, then cut into squares.
