New Orleans is known for many things, as the hometown of jazz, the city of Mardi Gras, popular with foodies and history lovers alike. A lot of time has passed since the hurricane of 2005 and the city has risen from despair to reclaim its title as the most joyous city in America. Unlike much of the United States, history is visible from street view and the city's charming façade is a study in architecture, with a lived-in feel that comes from hundreds of years of discourse with the past.

As the birthplace of jazz you'll find its hypnotic beats played on street corners, in live music venues and rustic bars on any night of the week, as crucial to the city soundtrack as the ringing of the streetcar's bells. Pull up a time-worn wooden stool at a sticky table in any one of the city's bars, order a cool drink and sit back as you're transported to another time via the sensation of jazz.

Cocktail connoisseurs will find plenty to tempt their taste buds in The Big Easy, from the fiery Sazerac to the lurid hurricane, the frosty daiquiri or the refreshing mint julep. And if you're hungry, then bring your appetite to the table as New Orleans will take you on an epicurean adventure that you'll never forget. If you're feeling adventurous there's everything from the weird to the wonderful. You can experience alligator sausage and shrimp cheesecake – no, really – or dig in to a mouth-watering plate of shrimp jambalaya, red beans and rice or crayfish gumbo – all variations of comforting stews.

Breakfast can start in the most indulgent way possible with a light fritter of dough dusted with a thick blanket of powdered sugar, served with a cup of chicory coffee. The beignet is possibly the most famous of all New Orleans' dishes, but sadly not the most waistline-friendly! Get yours at Café du Monde for the most authentic experience – it was founded in 1862.

Work off your indulgent dinners as you stroll around the atmospheric city and its surrounds. Take in the cultural heart of the city in the French Quarter; a little slice of Paris in the United States,

or head to Bayou St John to watch the fireflies. New Orleans' faded glamour is tinged with a hint of melancholy that hides in the shadows behind its lively joie de vivre, so take the time to visit some of the areas devastated by Katrina and observe how the residents have pulled together to rebuild, remain strong and above all, move on. Nearby there are many plantation homes and antebellum mansions which you can visit: Oak Alley is a renowned house with a sweeping drive lined with the oaks that give it its name.

After your time in the city you'll board NCL Dawn for your cruise around the Caribbean coast of Central America. You'll visit attractive Cozumel, a beach resort on the Yucatan Peninsula which offers plenty of snorkelling and visits to the Mayan ruins of mainland Mexico, and Roatan, an unspoilt ecotourists dream off the coast of Honduras. At Harvest Caye you can enjoy a wealth of beach activities at Norwegian's private cruise port, while Costa Maya is a coastal paradise rich with ruins and soft sandy beaches. It's a final hit of Caribbean sun before you sail back to New Orleans for your flight home.

# BIG STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

**I**F YOU were offered a daily pill that could reduce your risk of Type 2 diabetes, cancer, heart disease and stroke, give you a healthy dose of vitamin D, help you lose weight, tone up and increase your stamina, would you take it?

The answer is bound to be yes but before you go searching for this new wonder drug, here's the best bit: the benefits are all yours with a brisk daily walk.

Hard to believe? Time and time again the evidence supports claims that walking reduces the risk of chronic diseases.

In 2008, University College London researchers published a review of the most robust walking studies carried out between 1970 and 2007. They concluded that walking cut the risk of cardiovascular disease by 31 per cent and the risk of dying during

the 12-year study period was reduced by 32 per cent for both men and women. Those who walked briskly for longer had the greatest protection.

Other studies have provided similar results.

Walking for up to 30 minutes as part of a daily commute was found to decrease the risk of stroke in men and women by between eight and 11 per cent, while brisk walking was found to have a similar lowering effect on high blood pressure, Type 2 diabetes and high cholesterol as

running. And even if you're physically inactive now, just 20 minutes of brisk walking every day is enough to lower your risk of suffering an early death by up to 30 per cent.

The NHS recommends we do 150 minutes of moderate-intensity exercise per week and this suddenly sounds a whole lot easier to achieve when you factor in walking, although you'll need to walk as if you're in a rush.

Better still, some studies suggest walking doesn't increase your appetite in the way some

high-intensity workouts can (your weight loss attempts may backfire if you work out too intensely and end up eating all or more of your burned calories).

#### GET STARTED

Your new plan can take effect from the minute you read this.

"Walking is a great way for non-exercisers to begin a fitness programme as it's simple, free and you already know how to do it," says personal trainer Jessica Smith (jessicasmithtv.com).

"It's a great way for people new to exercise to build their fitness base and endurance level and feel successful about a regular workout plan. Plus it's easy on the joints, which makes it a great alternative to jogging for anyone with knee or hip issues."

To make walking part of your routine, Jessica recommends

setting a weekly goal, such as walking on a certain number of days (between two and five, depending on your fitness level) and marking it on your calendar to make sure you do not forget.

#### STEP IT UP

Start by adding incidental walks to your day, such as walking to the shops or getting off the bus early.

Once you're moving more, taking part in sociable walking groups that meet every week can keep you motivated.

"Many of our walkers have been diagnosed with diabetes or high blood pressure, or they want to lose weight," says Charlie Coward of Walking for Health (walkingforhealth.org.uk). "People initially join because of the benefits of being active but what encourages them to stay is the social aspect to our meet-ups."

## Bright idea to zap

**Q** I HAVE read that in some newer aeroplanes, the toilet compartment is lit by blue light. Could this be at all harmful to the eyes and even contribute to macular degeneration?

**A** I THINK you are referring to the ultraviolet (UV) light that is now being used on some aircraft for cleaning purposes. It is not used to light up the toilet compartment when someone is using it but rather the light comes on when the compartment is vacated.

It shines on all the surfaces for a few seconds and apparently this is a very effective way of killing all types of germs. The UV rays used are a different wavelength from those used in tanning beds and are not harmful to the eyes or the skin.

**Q** FOR the past three years I have suffered from a terrible skin irritation in my genital area that I think might be eczema. I am desperate to get rid of it as it has ruined any closeness with my husband but I am afraid to go to the doctor about this. I am 65.

**A** IN younger women genital itching is often due to thrush but this is unusual after the menopause. Instead irritation is often caused by the dryness that can occur when oestrogen levels are very low.

However this does not tend to cause extreme itching and I wonder if you have the skin condition lichen sclerosis. This

causes the body's immune system to attack the skin cells, making them inflamed, sore and itchy. This is followed by scarring, which makes it uncomfortable to have sex as the entrance to the vagina becomes smaller and cannot stretch.

Without treatment the condition can lead to a slightly increased risk of vulval cancer so it is very important that you see a doctor and get a proper diagnosis. If your usual GP is male I am sure he won't mind if you arrange to see one of his female colleagues. Or you could ask the practice nurse if she could be with you while you see the doctor.

Effective treatment, in the form of strong steroid cream, can relieve the irritation, stop further scarring and also prevent the increased risk of cancer so it is important you do get down to the surgery.

**Q** FOLLOWING an accident 20 years ago I damaged my lower back and have spent a lot of time in a wheelchair ever since. About two years ago I started getting pins and needles in my

feet. Today my feet are painful all the time and my legs permanently feel cold. Painkillers are ineffective.

**What could be causing this? I am a Type 2 diabetic and have suffered from a heart attack in the past.**

**A** I SUSPECT you have two different problems in your legs. The cold feeling is probably due to poor circulation from narrowed arteries. The best treatment for this is to continue with the medication you have been given following your heart attack, including statins. Eat a healthy diet and most importantly, do not smoke.

Exercising your legs will help as well, though I accept this is difficult for you as you spend much of your time in a wheelchair. The pins and needles suggest you have pressure on the nerves that supply your legs.

The best medicines for this are ones that alter the messages from nerves to the brain, such as amitriptyline, gabapentin or carbamazepine. Unlike standard painkillers these take time to become fully effective and they

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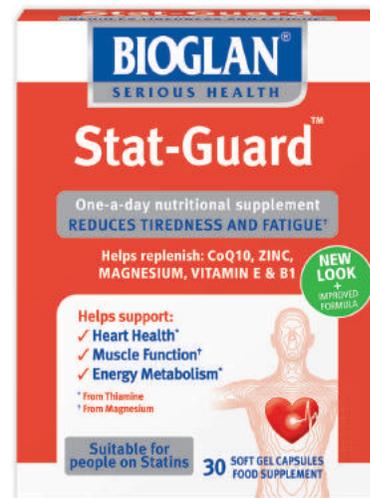

**E**VER wondered why your joints pop? Way back in 1947 it was thought that cracking your knuckles made a sound because of the formation of a bubble in joint fluid. A mere 68 years after this theory was first proposed and then discredited, Professor Gregory Kawchuk and his team at the University of Alberta have confirmed it.

He says: "It's a little bit like forming a vacuum. As the joint surfaces suddenly separate, there is no more fluid available to fill the increasing joint volume so a cavity is created and that event is what's associated with the sound."

What is happening is that your joints are being expanded when you pop them and as the space within the joint is increased, the pressure within the joint drops.

Due to this pressure drop, carbon dioxide is expelled and this release of gas is what creates the crack or pop that you hear when you crack your knuckles.

Yet these sounds can also be created by ligaments or tendons quickly snapping over bone as does happen in someone with "snapping hip". With snapping hip the iliotibial band (a tendon) or tensor fascia latae muscle on the side of your hip snaps over the femur, creating a snap or popping sound. The reason this muscle or tendon snaps over the hip is usually because they are too tight. With proper stretching or use of a foam roller this can often be resolved.

Another possible reason your joints could be making sounds is due to increased ligament laxity. Some people have inherently looser ligaments than others.

Ligaments provide passive structural support for our joints whereas muscles provide active

support for our joints. We can control our muscles but we cannot control ligaments.

A person with increased ligament laxity or looseness makes their joints more susceptible to increased motion within the joint and therefore increased ability to expand, release gas and make a sound.

#### WILL CRACKING KNUCKLES CAUSE ARTHRITIS?

Your joints, including those in your knuckles, are surrounded by a membrane called the synovial membrane which forms a capsule around the ends of your bones.

Inside this membrane is synovial fluid which acts as a

**S**OME eight million of us suffer from the irksome problem of haemorrhoids, or piles, according to recent estimates. Yet NHS data shows that surprisingly few come forward for treatment.

And perhaps it's little wonder. Surgery can leave patients in pain for weeks afterwards. Not to mention the embarrassment factor. Only sexually transmitted diseases cause people more medical blushes, a survey by YouPoll reveals. One in seven piles sufferers even avoids sport or taking a holiday, and one in six has needed to take time off work. But there is a new treatment that could shrink piles without the worry.

The treatment works by applying a very low voltage current to the base of the pile for up to ten

minutes, causing it to shrink. This procedure is completely non-invasive - no needles or sharp instruments are used. Many patients feel instant relief from the moment they stand up. Almost all can then return to normal activities without having

to spend time recovering. More than 150,000 patients have now been treated worldwide. Arabella Maudslay, a private carer from Kent, said, "I had piles for many years and finally ended up getting a banding procedure from an NHS consultant, but the piles never really went away."

"I struggled on for another 10 years. A few months ago I went dog training with some friends and ended up bleeding in the pub. A horrendous situation. Golf had also become almost impossible and standing for any length of time. It really was affecting my whole life."

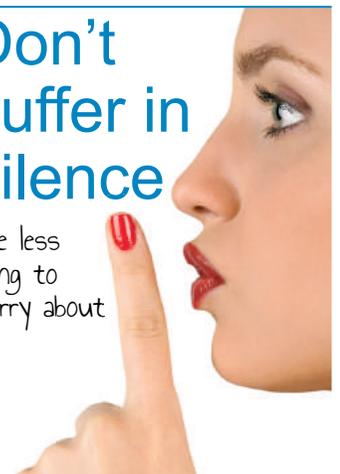

**CRUNCH TIME:** Popping joints can be the sound of gas releasing

lubricant and shock absorber so your bones don't grind together when you move.

Yet if you have osteoarthritis, the cartilage within your joints is progressively being damaged and the amount of synovial fluid is typically reduced as well.

The pain and joint stiffness that you feel is a result of your bones starting to come into contact with each other as cartilage and synovial fluid diminishes.

To date, research has not shown a correlation between knuckle cracking and osteoarthritis in your hands. In one study of more than 200 people the prevalence of osteoarthritis in any joint was similar among those who cracked knuckles and those who did not.

**WHEN DO POPPING NOISES INDICATE JOINT DAMAGE?**

While those funny popping sounds are probably innocuous, other grinding noises, known as crepitus,

can be a sign of damaged cartilage or inflammation.

When cartilage deteriorates it creates a rough surface and can even leave parts of bone exposed. The creak and grind of crepitus occurs when the rough surfaces or exposed parts of bone rub against each other. This is osteoarthritis and the noise is common in the knee and neck. It is often painful.

Unfortunately, once you become aware of these grinding sounds there's little you can do to prevent further cartilage deterioration.

Osteoarthritis is primarily controlled by your genes, although keeping your weight under control can help reduce symptoms.

Confusingly, your degree of cartilage degeneration may not correlate closely with the amount of pain you feel. It seems to depend on how pain signals are amplified or dampened down in the brain but no one is really sure what influences that. Severely

painful crepitus is best checked out by a health professional. In rare cases it can be caused by a fracture – the two broken fragments of bone rubbing together is what makes the noise.

If worn cartilage is the cause, you should try to continue to be as active as possible. Cartilage has a poor supply of blood and relies on movement to obtain nutrients.

The bottom line is noise plus pain is much more likely to be an indication of a problem needing medical input than a noisy joint alone. If in doubt, ask your doctor or physiotherapist to check it out.

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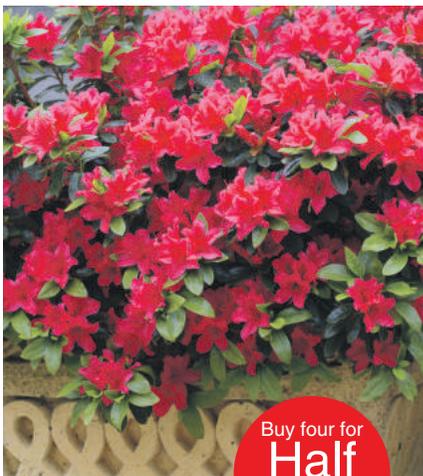
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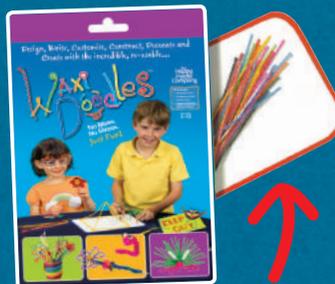
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
