

Secrets of the bloodbath

ONCE, when working for a Far Eastern TV company, I had to return to the office very late to fetch something. I was shocked to discover all my colleagues still there, computers off, having an urgent discussion.

"We try to re-educate ourselves," their spokesman said solemnly. "To learn from our mistakes and see what we can do better."

This creditably earnest approach to work might be alien to us Brits, but there other cultures where it runs strong. **THE SOMME 1916: FROM BOTH SIDES OF THE WIRE** (BBC2) continued its straight-from-the-trenches analysis of the slaughter, digging up more surprises than expected.

Military archaeologist Peter Barton (clad in an Indiana Jones-

style ensemble of big hats and natty scarves) goes deeper than any other popular historian, viewing the conflict from above, below, and most importantly, all angles.

Germany might have lost the Great War but when victory involved such massive losses of life all-round, that's a debatable term. What became obvious from last night's programme is that both sides approached the campaign in a

different spirit. Germany's attitude was defensive, trying to keep things at bay whilst concentrating on gains in the East.

That called for an adaptable, flexible attitude to military strategy and it was stamped through every one of the Kaiser's men like the writing on a stick of rock. Everyone was encouraged to write reports after every engagement, listing what could have been done better.

Individuals were encouraged to come up with solutions and tricks, and they did, not least by hiding in shell holes under dirty tarpaulins to confuse the spotter planes of the Royal Flying Corps.

This attitude contrasted strongly with that of our General Haig, a cavalry man itching to send his horsemen charging in as if it was 1815. When he got his way, the

losses (as Barton's access to secret German papers revealed) were far greater than the British public was allowed to know. Things also differed, depressingly so, in the treatment of prisoners of war.

The phrase: "we have ways of making you talk" is generally delivered in a Prussian accent but it was the British who issued veiled threats (on a printed card) before interrogating prisoners. The Germans, sensibly, worked out that people talked more freely when relaxed. Fascinating stuff, a refresh, rather than a rewrite of an oft-told story, and, being based so strongly on the letters of ordinary Tommies and Fritzes, rich in human detail.

I like Dave Myers' re-pointing-reglazing-historical-travelogue **THE HAIRY BUILDER** (BBC2) for the same reasons. Last night he was

in the North-East, restoring the famous Roker Lighthouse.

There's a catch with lighthouses, of course. Everything's circular, a nightmare for furniture, let alone wooden panelling. In spite of these difficulties, it was obvious that the builders had intended it to be a thing of beauty. Few might have gone inside, except the keepers and their families, but there were brass banisters, panelled walls, even the lamp room had decorative tiling.

It was a case of nothing but the finest for Sunderland, a booming coal port at the time of construction. That attitude was alive and well amongst the fishermen Dave met on the pier.

One canny lad filleted a mackerel, dipped it in soy, lime juice and jalapeno peppers and handed it to Dave. Sunderland sushi.

Pour over the pureed tomatoes and olive oil, and sprinkle with parsley.</p> <p>3) Add salt and freshly ground pepper to taste.</p> <p>4) Toss the ingredients together so that the vegetables are evenly coated. Finally, add about 100ml of water to the dish.</p> <p>5) Bake in the preheated oven for 90 minutes, checking after 1 hour to stir the veg and also add a bit more water if necessary. The aim is to have no water left and for the vegetables to be crisp on top and around the edge.</p> <p>6) Cool slightly before serving, or serve at room temperature.</p>

MPs slam FCA in HBOS report

REGULATORS "asleep at the wheel" during the second worst failure in Britain's banking history are today called to account in a damning report on their response to the near-collapse of HBOS more than seven years ago.

A report by the House of Commons Treasury Committee accuses financial industry watchdogs of "spectacular failures" and claims there is still more to be done to win public confidence.

MPs branded the decision by the Financial Reporting Council not to investigate the auditing of HBOS before it had received all the information on the crisis a "serious mistake" and the organisation had shown a "lack of curiosity and diligence".

The committee argues that the case for a new enforcement body, previously rejected by the Treasury, merits "serious re-examination" and urges the Treasury to appoint an independent person to undertake a review.

HBOS was acquired in a rescue deal by Lloyds TSB in 2009

before a £20billion taxpayer funded bailout of the combined group.

Andrew Tyrrie, pictured, chairman of the Treasury Select Committee, said: "The regulators failed, both before and after the HBOS crisis. Seven years on, we now know just how badly... It took persistent pressure from the Treasury Committee to ensure these failures weren't swept under the carpet.

"So the HBOS experience called for the Financial Conduct Authority and Prudential Regulation Authority to exhibit greater vigilance and energy if they are to win public confidence. This has on occasion been lacking.

"A lot is at stake. The fact is the Financial Services Authority did not succeed in protecting consumers from spectacular regulatory failures. The creation of the FCA and PRA has been an opportunity to build something much better. This is still work in progress, particularly at FCA."



Bookie's shares leap over deal

WILLIAM Hill shares jumped 15¼p to 328¼p after an approach from gaming groups Rank and 888 Holdings to join forces.

The bookmaker is seen as vulnerable to a bid after chief executive James Henderson left last week as it looks to turn around its online business.

Rank and 888 said there was "significant industrial logic" in the near-£5billion combination but no formal approach has been made.

Hill said it would "listen to and consider" any proposal, but added: "It is not clear that a combination will enhance William Hill's strategic positioning or deliver superior value to its strategy, which is focused on increasing the group's diversification by growing its digital and international businesses."

Kenkos leisure analyst Simon French said: "William Hill shareholders are likely to be cautious about the merits of any deal."

DONNA KARAN'S FIRM IN BUYOUT

LUXURY goods giant LVMH (Moët Hennessy Louis Vuitton) has agreed to sell the company behind the Donna Karan and DKNY fashion brands to US clothing firm G-III Apparel for £495million.

Founder Donna Karan, who sold the brand to LVMH in 2001, stepped down as chief designer last year and a new design team was put in place.

G-III owns luxury swimwear brand Vilebriquin and holds the licences to make clothes for Ivanka Trump, Calvin Klein and Tommy Hilffiger.

The company's chief executive Morris Goldfarb said: "Donna Karan International is an iconic global fashion company. It brings increased scale and diversification."

Ryanair cuts back on UK flights

RYANAIR will start cutting flights from the UK later this year and instead focus on growth at EU airports following the Brexit vote.

The budget airline is on course for a 12 per cent rise in annual profit to about 1.4 billion euros (£1.17billion) but warned of "significant risks to the downside". It lifted first-quarter profit by

4 per cent to £214million as passenger numbers grew 11 per cent to 31.2 million and its planes flew 94 per cent full. Average fares fell 10 per cent to under £33.50 and are expected to drop at least 6 per cent in the second quarter.

Chief executive Michael O'Leary said: "This winter we will cut capacity and frequency on many London Stansted routes."

Bid to oust tool hire chairman

SPEEDY Hire's biggest shareholder has called for the removal of the tool hire company's executive chairman.

Toscafund, which owns 19.5 per cent, claimed Jan Astrand was "indecisive as a business leader, failed to support executive management fully and failed to con-

sult with shareholders regarding key board appointments".

It wants to replace him with David Shearer, ex-chairman of builder Crest Nicholson. Toscafund founder Martin Hughes said: "This is the first time in our 16-year history that we have felt compelled to take such action."

BP and Shell were on the slide yesterday, down 11¼p to 440¼p and 54¼p to 2093½p, as crude prices fell by more than 2 per cent to a two-month low.

for both socialism and alphabet reform...

6. ...his new alphabet was designed to eliminate inconsistencies in English spelling. He left a large amount of money to promote his new alphabet but it never became popular.

7. He was a lifelong vegetarian and opposed British involvement in the First World War.

8. Because of his anti-war pamphlets and speeches he was expelled from the Dramatists' Club.

9. "We don't stop playing because we grow old; we grow old because we stop playing." (George Bernard Shaw).

10. He died aged 94 of kidney problems caused by a fall from a ladder while pruning a tree.

from a geographical perspective – he claims his old Sky team-mate will win at least one gold medal in Brazil, with the first of those, the road race, on Rio's opening day of action.

Wiggins, 36, said: "It's probably harder for him this time. He has to travel out to a completely different continent.

"He can do it, definitely. The way he won the Tour, that form is not going to go anywhere for two weeks. If anyone can do it, he can do it of all those people there at the Tour.

"All I had to do was keep my head on for 10 days and do the same performance. The power I averaged that day, I knew nothing was going to change.

"There weren't too many challenges for me to overcome – other than I couldn't get down my lane to my home for a couple of days."

FINA, swimming's world governing body, yesterday banned three Russian swimmers from competing.

Nikita Lobintsev, Vladimir Morozov and Daria Ustinova have all been rejected because their names appeared in Richard McLaren's WADA damning independent report into state-directed doping.

The Russian authorities have withdrawn Mikhail Dovgalyuk, Yulia Efimova, Natalia Lovtsova and open-water swimmer Anastasia Krapivina from consideration as all have served doping bans before. FINA are the first international sports

federation to ban any Russian athletes since the International Olympic Committee's decision not to issue a blanket ban on the country, instead leaving the issue of eligibility up to each international federation.

Russia's three-member archery team have been cleared to take part at the World Archery Federation.

Yulia Stepanova, the whistleblower who helped uncover the

biggest doping scandal in decades, wants a review of her Olympic ban.

Stepanova hopes of competing next month as an independent athlete were dashed when the IOC ruled on Sunday that no Russian athlete with a doping background could take part.

Inhab Abdelrahman, the first Egyptian to win a world athletics medal with his javelin

silver at last year's world athletics championships, has been suspended for failing a doping test.

Abdelrahman said: "I'm a million per cent innocent. I feel I'm in a nightmare.

"I did urine and blood tests in February and the results were negative. I was also tested in May and the result was negative. Why is this the only positive result?"

Lewis set for race to finish

MERCEDES boss Toto Wolff is sure that the drivers' championship battle between Lewis Hamilton and Nico Rosberg will go down to the wire.

Hamilton heads the title race for the first time this term, with his win in Hungary on Sunday establishing a six-point lead over Rosberg.

Hamilton has won five out of the last six races to wipe out his team-mate's 43-point advantage. Wolff said: "At the beginning of the season he won so many points against Lewis you can see it swings

Coe now goes from zero to hero

HOLD ON a minute, is the villain of the piece now the hero?

Amid the shambles of the International Olympic Committee's decision not to ban Russia from Rio next month, one man suddenly stands tall, proud and at the helm of his sport like a beacon for the future: Lord Coe.

As a track and field athlete, Sebastian Coe's timing was normally immaculate.

Ironically, in Moscow 36 years ago, he got it wrong at the start of the week with his tactics in the 800metres before bidding his time, talking to people in the know, and returning to win 1500m gold a few days later.

This morning, Lord Coe has a gold medal of a different kind around his neck, as the leader who was strong enough to stand up to doping and say 'No' to Russia.

Just like the IOC should have done, before sending the decision of whether Russia's sportsmen and women should be in Rio back to the international federations to decide.

One federation had already decided – the International Association of Athletics Federations, of which Lord Coe is the president, and acted swiftly and powerfully to prevent the nation from taking part in international competition,

including the Olympic Games in Rio. This is the same Lord Coe who was vilified in so many quarters – not this one I may add – after becoming president for not knowing about the state-sponsored doping that had taken place in Russia.

In retrospect, he was wrong to say there was a "declaration of war" launched against his sport when the stories broke of the drugs shame in Russia. It was not a declaration of war, it was the uncovering of facts.

Facts that Lord Coe acted upon. And look where it has taken him.

There were calls at the time for him to be removed as IAAF president, saying he should have been aware of what was happening and there was even a summons to Parliament.

But here we are, with the future becoming the present quicker than most thought – the Olympic opening ceremony in Rio is just 10 days away – and

suddenly the sport that has one of the worst reputations for doping is now being viewed as a standard-bearer for others to follow.

In the end, Lord Coe played it perfectly. Like he always does.

He fended off the criticism, he answered the questions that he wanted to and he led with passionate decision-making, judgment and belief to start ensuring his sport can regain its credibility.

No one expected him to have an impact as fast as this, because turning around a sport can take a lifetime, let alone a year; and surely few expected him to bounce back from hogging the headlines for the wrong reasons to now be offering help to other federations as they decide what to do.

Tennis is allowing Russian athletes to be in Rio, so is archery, and others will follow suit. Others might say 'No'.

But in 10 days, with the Olympic ceremony on Friday week? How on earth can this be sorted by then?

The IAAF weighed up the options, set the date for their decision and last month made it, long before the Games.

Ironically, it was upheld by the IOC, who now stand accused of "bottling it" and making a "spineless" choice for their overall judgment on Russia amid the fiercest criticism from sports stars past and present.

And as for those who doubted Lord Coe...

A classic show as Konta has first title

JOHANNA KONTA ensured she took in every second of one of the best moments of her life as she secured her first WTA Tour title.

"It's an incredibly humbling experience," said British No 1 Konta after beating Venus Williams 7-5, 5-7, 6-2 to win the Bank of the West Classic in California.

"I wanted to leave it all out there, but also absorb everything that I could possibly reinvest in my career.

"It's a validation of all the hard work you've put in and a motivator on the things you want to keep improving on, and the lengths you might go to in order to become that much better at your discipline.

"Venus Williams doesn't need an introduction, and I knew that I'd need to stay focused on myself and to be grateful for the experience and try to learn from her within the match."

'Every single point was a battle'

Konta was the first British woman to win this event since Sue Barker in 1977 and she has risen four places to No 14 in the world.

She had looked to be coasting to victory when leading by a set and 4-1 in the second, but Williams won six of the next seven games to level it at one set all.

However, the 25-year-old regained her composure and after securing a double break in the deciding set she did not make the same mistake again. Williams, having saved two match points, hit a return into the net to hand Konta victory after two hours and 18 minutes.

Konta's service game was key to the win and she was regularly sending down serves in excess of 100mph and hit 12 aces to just three from Williams.

Konta, who also beat Williams at the Australian Open, said: "Every single point was a battle, and I tried to win as many battles as possible."

Wimbledon semi-finalist Williams admitted that she was not at her best but said it was tough to keep up with Konta. "Credit to her for playing great tennis," said Williams. "She played at such a high level."

Cook gets all

ALASTAIR COOK was happy to take criticism of his captaincy squarely on the chin after victory in the second Investec Test levelled the series.

Even more so after his decision to stick with Moeen Ali as sole spinner was vindicated with the key wickets as England charged to a 330-run victory that had never really been in serious doubt since the opening day.

The series now stands at 1-1 with two to play.

But if there was one dark cloud amongst the silver linings in Manchester, dark enough to wipe the smile of Cook's face, it was the loss of Ben Stokes, who limped from proceedings with what an MRI scan today is expected to reveal as a low grade calf tear. Stokes, who had left the field after

pulling up in his follow-through clutching his right calf in his third over and England's sixth after lunch, later returned to the field to shake hands walking reasonably easily.

But with just eight days before the third Test at Edgbaston, he is a major doubt.

The continued emergence of Chris Woakes into the role of near equal, rather than Stokes-lite, will leave the home camp slightly less troubled.

As will the fact that this was a victory with roots in other parts of the dressing room, for all that Stokes bowled well in his comeback match after knee surgery.

The England captain winning the toss for the

first time against his Pakistan counterpart Misbah-ul-Haq in five attempts stretching back to Abu Dhabi in October was one strand.

Joe Root's sensational man-of-the-match display with the bat (254 and 71 not out) had England in complete control of the scoreboard from tea on day one.

And then there were was the continued good form of Woakes, who took another seven wickets here, and five from Moeen, who - like some artful pickpocket - continues to leave world-class batsmen wondering how he removes their valuables in front of their eyes without any noticeable guile.

Crucially England also worked out a strategy of how to play Yasir Shah, whose threat disintegrated so much from 10-141 at Lord's to 1-266 here that it was tempting to think the

dash had been put in the wrong place.

Lancashire also did their bit to help, providing not only a decent batting wicket but a lush square which refused to help Pakistan scuff the ball up like at Lord's and get the ball reversing quite as much.

Edgbaston and the Oval will no doubt receive polite requests for more of the same if they haven't already.

Criticism of Cook's decision to not enforce the follow-on surprised the England captain, who said afterwards he was slightly taken aback when returning to the team hotel on Sunday night.

But it had not knocked him enough to prevent him from batting on stubbornly with a carefree Root for nine overs in the morning,

flushed the disappointment of a 75-run Lord's defeat in the opening Test from their system.

"We came to this game under real pressure but the guys showed they had learnt from the experience at Lord's," he said.

"To put most of the things right that were wrong at Lord's in this game was a pretty good effort." Cook paid tribute

to man-of-the-match Joe Root, whose 254 in the first innings was a monumental contribution.

"It was one of the best innings I have ever seen," said Cook. "To get 325 runs in the match, take four catches and to burgle a wicket as well - he did not put a foot wrong. He is a world-class player."

Pakistan captain Misbah-ul-Haq echoed Cook's praise for Root, but

hinted he felt England were in danger of being a two-man team.

He also warned that leg-spinner Yasir Shah, who had a torrid time, will bounce back at Edgbaston.

He said: "Their top order delivered and that set the tone but others are not in great nick.

"England played Yasir well. But we know he is a strong character and he will come back."

ONE MAN likely to celebrate England's victory more than most will be James Vince - who will no doubt toast it with yet another drink in the Last Chance Saloon.

The Hampshire batsman was lucky to be picked for this Test in the first place, earning a stay of execution after England opted against including Adil Rashid as a second spinner.

It then appeared his final opportunity to prove himself worthy of a place in a batting-heavy line-up that, with Vince in at four, has Jonny Bairstow

After Stokes's departure shortly after lunch, Moeen took over the baton to whip out Mohammad Hafeez and Younis Khan before Woakes bagged Misbah and Sarfraz Ahmed.

At 163-6 the writing was on the wall and Anderson, Moeen, Root and Woakes stripped away the last pieces of resistance bit by bit, Mohammad Amir eventually holing out to Stuart Broad at mid-off to end Pakistan's innings at 234 and win the match.

Whatever the results of the scan on Stokes's calf this morning, he is not going to be risked in Birmingham, which is likely

to see an opportunity open for a bowler - either Steve Finn or Jake Ball, who are near the front of the queue.

The third Test starting next Wednesday might just come a touch early for Mark Wood, who made his recent comeback from an ankle injury with the Lions but probably needs to get a Championship match with Durham under his belt before internationals.

Aside from the injury to Stokes, England's batting may not quite have the solidity that Cook would like. His own form is good, with contributions here of 105 and 76 not out, and Root is unquestionably turning into one of the best in the world.

But behind that there are genuine concerns about the rest of the batting line-up with Cook admitting there is worrying inexperience, lack of form or both in three out of the top five positions.

coming in at No7, Moeen Ali at No8 and Chris Woakes one place lower. England's No10 for this match? Stuart Broad, who has a Test century to his name.

Even James Anderson, the designated No11, has a top-score in Tests of 81.

Vince, whose best so far is 42, has a total of just 130 runs in his four Tests to date at an average of 18.57.

He is running out of time to convince the doubters and this match appeared to be his final chance. Yet despite failing again in England's first innings - scoring a scratchy 18 before being undone by yet another flashy drive - circumstances may have conspired to offer him another opportunity in next week's third Test at Edgbaston.

England's victory could mean they are reluctant to

change a winning team. That in itself may not save Vince, who fluffed the chance to get a big score after his team were given the opportunity to bat first on a belter of a pitch.

Joe Root and Alastair Cook, piled up 506 runs between them in this match. And it was that pair's ability to score the extra runs their side wanted yesterday morning that meant Vince was not required to bat in England's second innings.

That would have been a horrible situation for the 25-year-old. With not enough

time to make a significant score and, chasing quick runs, the likelihood is he would have fallen cheaply again.

Spared that ordeal, Vince could argue one bad shot cost him in this match, although he was also dropped on six in his only innings. Still, batting once in a landslide win may have been enough to spare him from the axe.

The injury to Ben Stokes that puts his availability for Edgbaston in doubt, is another card that has fallen in Vince's favour. If the all-rounder is not fit then

England, who would be a bowler down, would probably be forced to retain Vince and recall a seamer in Jake Ball or Steven Finn to replace Stokes.

Beyond the next Test in Birmingham, there is the question of Jos Buttler. The wicketkeeper was close to being called up as a specialist batsman for this series and even though a broken thumb now prevents him from playing, he is the man most likely to replace Vince this winter if the incumbent's struggles continue.
