## India leader calls emergency meeting as death toll rises in Kashmir violence

India's prime minister called an emergency meeting Tuesday over escalating anti-India protests in Kashmir, where at least 29 people have died in clashes and hospitals are struggling with hundreds of injured.

The protests erupted during the weekend after Indian troops killed the popular, young leader of the largest rebel group in the Indian-administered region that has been beset by an insurgency since the 1990s.

Defying curfews and paramilitary troops and riot police on patrol, crowds of youths threw stones at officers and rallied in the main city of Srinagar and around the region. Separatist politicians, most of them under house arrest, extended a call for a general strike through

Wednesday.

A young man was killed Tuesday after government forces shot protesters who attacked a police station in the Kupwara area and burned a police vehicle trapping some police, police said. At least two other civilians were reported injured. Since the weekend, 28 civilians and one policeman have been killed.

Doctors and government officials said they were struggling after hundreds of civilians were admitted to hospitals with bullet and pellet wounds. At least 100 troops have been injured.

Amid reported scuffles between law enforcement and hospital staff, many injured protesters said they were beaten up by police and paramilitary soldiers while on the way to hospitals. Authorities said they would investigate the complaints.

Prime Minister Narendra

Modi, having just returned from a four-nation tour in Africa, called a high-level government meeting to discuss how to calm the region and restore peace. Indian authorities had said Monday they sent at least 2,000 more law-enforcement troops to the mountainous region, where hundreds of thousands already are deployed permanently.

Across the region, businesses were shuttered and cellphone and mobile Internet services were suspended. Thousands thronged Tral town, despite restrictions, to participate in the memorial service for rebel leader Burhan Wani.

The conflict dates to 1947, when India and Pakistan gained independence from Britain but disagreed on which country would get Kashmir. They have fought two of their three subsequent wars over Kashmir, while each administers a part of it.

On the Indian side, many of the 12 million residents resent the Indian troop presence and back rebel demands for independence or a merger with Pakistan. Since the 1990s, more than 68,000 people have been killed in Kashmir's uprising against Indian rule and the Indian military crackdown.

## Austria seizes Hitler's birth home to deter neo-Nazi visitors

Austria's government agreed to expropriate the house in which Adolf Hitler was born in order to prevent neo-Nazis from using it as a pilgrimage site.

Parliament is expected to decide what to do with the building this year, according to an Interior Ministry

spokesman. The ministry has been renting the house in the town of Braunau am Inn, a three-hour drive west of Vienna, since 1972.

Because Hitler is so closely associated with the site "makes it unlike any other place in right-extremist culture," a government-appointed commission wrote this year. The former German chancellor and leader of the Nazi Party was

born there in 1889.

Negotiations to buy the house from the owner broke down this year, forcing the government to exercise its right of eminent domain, according to legislation that was put before parliament. While heritage-preservation rules prevent the state from razing the 17th-century structure, Austria's constitution also outlaws any form of Nazi expression.

"Since it can't be torn down, we'll probably find some application with educational value, like a museum," Vice Chancellor Reinhold Mitterlehner told journalists in Vienna.



# Haslem on board with his new role

Veteran Udonis Haslem says Dwyane Wade's departure to Chicago 'could have been avoided'

He's focused on taking increased leadership role

Says he and Chris Bosh plan team trip with newcomers

For 13 years Udonis Haslem envisioned his career ending only one way: with he and Dwyane Wade in Miami Heat uniforms.

But it won't. And Haslem — the only remaining member of the Heat's three NBA championship teams — said he won't wear the title of last man standing "as a badge of honor."

"It's bittersweet, obviously," said Haslem, who signed a one-year, \$4 million contract Sunday during a flurry of signings the Heat made in the aftermath of Wade's decision to head home and play for the Chicago Bulls.

"You know it's something to talk about when I'm done — I was the last one left," Haslem continued. "But while I'm in right now, it's still hard. It's not going to be easy. Like I said, you kind of write the

story a certain way. You hope it will end that way. We just always talked about finishing it together. It just didn't work out that way."

Wade's departure — after he passed on a two-year, \$40 million offer from Miami to sign a two-year, \$47 million deal with the Bulls — has obviously

# McIlroy eager to add more majors

Rory McIlroy couldn't defend 2014 British Open title because of injury

He has the most majors of golf's current Fab Four

Rory McIlroy still considers himself a full-fledged member of the Fab Four.

No chance he'll get kicked out of the group, certainly not without putting up quite a fight.

As if to show he's still as relevant as ever among golf's elite players, even as he approaches the two-year mark since the last of his major titles, McIlroy pulled no punches Tuesday leading to the British Open at Royal Troon.

He called out golf for its lax drug-testing procedures and questioned the

relevance of his sport being part of the Olympics, saying he wasn't even sure he'd watch it on TV.

# Turner hopes to emerge as starter

Six players are competing for two starting guard spots

The Dolphins like Billy Turner's physicality

Jermon Bushrod, off shoulder surgery, expects to be cleared for the start of training camp July 29

The Dolphins' six-way battle for two starting guard spots includes two men who say they have never played guard in a game in their lives (tackles Laremy Tunsil and Jermon Bushrod), jack-of-all trades Kraig Urbik, perpetually beleaguered Dallas Thomas and two veteran Dolphins draft picks eager to prove their worth — Billy Turner and Jamil Douglas.

Tunsil, Miami's ballyhooped first-round pick, is

expected to be a starter eventually this season, if not immediately. But among the other contenders, Turner has as good a chance as any to start, if he can hold off Bushrod, a former Pro Bowl tackle who's still awaiting medical clearance after offseason shoulder surgery.

Turner, the Dolphins' third-round pick in 2014, was Miami's first-team right guard in the June minicamp, though he also received work at tackle during the offseason program.

changed the direction the franchise is going.

The Heat spent the \$20 million in cap space it offered Wade to keep Haslem, combo guard Tyler Johnson and to sign a collection of journeymen who can be wiped off the salary cap sheet next summer.

Although Haslem said he's ready to take on the Heat's new direction, he still feels like losing Wade "could have been avoided."

Speaking to reporters by phone Tuesday from a golf tournament hosted by former Heat teammate Mike Miller in South Dakota, Haslem said he kept in contact with Wade throughout his free agency, and the two discussed the offers the 12-time All-Star received from other teams.

In the end, Haslem said he wished he could have done more to try and keep Wade from leaving. But he's not sure if it would have changed Wade's mind.

"Obviously, I wanted him to come back," Haslem, 36, said. "But I just know personally it was a

lot of things that he was feeling that I guess maybe he was just burying for a while, and it just came to a head at this particular summer, at this particular time. For whatever reason we — the organization — and him, we couldn't get to an agreement.

"In hindsight, I think back wondering if I should have pulled a Chris Paul, handcuffed him like [the Clippers] did DeAndre Jordan [after he agreed to a deal with the Mavericks in the summer of 2015] and made him change his mind."

Filling Wade's shoes on the court will be a tall order for the Heat.

Wade has been Miami's go-to-man in the fourth quarter his entire career and was the Heat's leading scorer this past season after 11-time All-Star Chris Bosh was sidelined by blood clots at the All-Star break for the second year in a row.

Haslem said it's likely the Heat will play a more uptempo style next season — similar to the one the team used in the second half of last season — to better utilize point guard

Goran Dragic's strengths in the open court.

As for the team's leadership responsibilities, Haslem, who has always been a good locker room leader and role model in practice, said he's ready to take on more.

"I've been looking at Ray Lewis videos and just different things to help me be better for what I need to do for this next phase of my career," Haslem said. "Even before I signed my contract, once I got the word that Dwyane was going to leave, my mind immediately switched to what I need to do to lead these guys and what I need to do to kind of make sure the new guys come in and understand the Heat way and continue the legacy going forward."

Last season, Haslem, Wade and Bosh shared the captain's responsibilities for the Heat.

Haslem said Wade used to be the one to handle the coordination of team dinners, trips to the movies and so forth. Haslem said he plans to take over those responsibilities while still being the guy who shows up early for practice, leaves late and stays in the ear of center Hassan Whiteside.

Haslem also said he and

Bosh have already begun brainstorming ideas for a team bonding trip together this summer.

Last year, the Heat met in California and went camping at Joshua Tree National Park.

Although Bosh and the Heat have yet to provide answers on Bosh's availability for next season, Haslem said Tuesday he's preparing as if Bosh will play.

"Nobody knows I guess physically what the situation is going to be with Chris," he said. "But me personally as a leader, in my mind, I'm preparing as if he's going to be here, he's going to be healthy, contributing. That's the way we're going to look at it. That's the positive approach I'm going to take with him."

One thing is for sure, the first day of practice this fall is going to feel weird.

"It's going to be one of those things that once you step in the gym for practice that first day that's when it's really going to be real," Haslem said. "That's when we're going to realize obviously Dwyane is not there, and there's a new core group of guys, a new step and a new direction we're heading in."

## McElwain: 'We've got arm talent'

HOOVER, ALA.

Florida won 10 games and advanced to the Southeastern Conference title game despite a sputtering passing offense that fell apart during the season's most important games.

Thanks to four new quarterbacks — including two transfers and two freshmen — coach Jim McElwain is confident he will find somebody who can fling the ball downfield.

"Here's the good thing — we've really got good arm talent," McElwain said. "I'm excited about being able to stretch the field vertically. Should be a lot of fun."

Junior Luke Del Rio appears to be the leading candidate at quarterback after an impressive spring game, though McElwain has not made a final decision. Austin Appleby, a graduate transfer from Purdue, and freshmen Felipe Franks and Kyle Trask are also in the mix.

Del Rio is the son of Oakland Raiders' coach Jack Del Rio. The 6-1 quarterback was at Alabama and Oregon State before transferring to Florida in 2015. He sat out last season per NCAA transfer rules.

"He is a good guy and a great quarterback," Florida junior offensive lineman David Sharpe said. "He's a great leader — a vocal leader."

Florida hopes an infusion of better quarterback play can help the Gators avoid a collapse similar to last year, when they lost three

consecutive lopsided games against Florida State, Alabama and Michigan to end the season.

"Very disappointed in how we finished," McElwain said. "Not something that we're proud of, and not something that, you know, I take very lightly. Yet, at the same time, it was an opportunity for us to kind of learn."

The SEC Eastern Division race appears wide open with Florida trying to fend off an improved Tennessee program. Georgia, South Carolina and Missouri all have new coaches while Kentucky and Vanderbilt haven't shown much reason for optimism.

Maybe that's why McElwain is so optimistic despite returning just 10 starters from last season.

"Things are good at the University of Florida," McElwain said. "And that's the way it should be."

One unresolved piece of business for the Gators involves two suspended players: receiver Antonio Callaway and quarterback Treon Harris. Both players were suspended in January for violating the university's code of conduct policy.

Callaway caught 35 passes for a team-high 678 yards last season and four touchdowns. Harris started nine games at quarterback but is expected to switch positions if he returns.

"They are back on campus, using the academic center and working out, and yet nothing has been resolved yet," McElwain said. "And there really isn't — there isn't a timetable on it. So that's about what it is right now."

Turner played with the first team throughout training camp last season before Douglas was surprisingly named the starter. But Douglas struggled, and Turner replaced him after four games and started the final 12.

"Last year, it was a little frustrating for me," Turner said. "My first year I was here, unfortunately, I got hurt and broke my foot. But I was able to come into training camp and get better. Unfortunately, I wasn't starting at the beginning of the year. I was happy I got to start. And as the season progressed, I was able to get better ... and lose some of my bad habits."

Former offensive line coach John Benton previously compared Turner to a "bull in a china shop," a powerful force who needed to refine his technique. Turner said having a new position coach (Chris Foerster) is "like learning a new language. There is going to be a challenge with that — breaking old habits and learning new techniques."

Though only three starters are determined — center Mike Pouncey and tackles Branden Albert and Ja'Wuan James — Turner said: "I think anyone that knows football knows that we have

the potential to be the best offensive line in football."

### GRIMES FALLOUT

The Dolphins and Buccaneers declined to comment about the latest offensive Twitter rant served up by Miko Grimes, wife of Tampa Bay and former Dolphins cornerback Brent Grimes.

Referring to Dolphins owner Stephen Ross and president/football operations Mike Tannenbaum, Miko Grimes tweeted: "Gotta respect Ross for keeping his Jew buddies employed but did he not see how Tannenbaum put the Jets in the dumpster w/that [Mark] Sanchez deal?"

The Anti-Defamation League on Tuesday said it is "outraged and deeply concerned with Ms. Grimes' recent comment, which evokes textbook anti-Semitic stereotypes and conspiracy theories about secret Jewish control. Her suggestion that an NFL front office would operate as a 'Jews-only club' is nothing less than classic, garden-variety anti-Semitism. ... Ms. Grimes needs to realize that her words were deeply offensive."

Miko Grimes also trashed Ryan Tannehill, as she typically has in the months before and after

the Dolphins released Brent Grimes in March. Comparing fans of former Lakers star Kobe Bryant with fans of Tannehill, Miko Grimes said: "Both are super stupid but at least Kobe was a baller. Tannehill is a bum!"

She also tweeted: "The Dolphins [expletive] stink! They will never be great as long as Stephen Ross is the owner, Tannenbaum is the G.M., and Tannehill is the QB!"

She said Grimes planned to retire if the Dolphins didn't release him and "no way I was gonna let him retire with a

bum at QB, G.M., and owner! No [expletive] way! We will go out on a high with a REAL QB, not a WR at QB!"

### WELKER UPDATE

Receiver Wes Welker, who dressed in a Dolphins uniform and served as a voluntary coach during part of the Dolphins' off-season program, told Sirius XM NFL Radio on Tuesday that there's a "a small percentage" he will play again.

Coach Adam Gase said last month that the team does not intend to sign Welker as a player.

## UM works to resolve issues with players

The Mark Walton matter was resolved this week with the lifting of the University of Miami running back's suspension after a DUI charge against him was dropped, but coach Mark Richt is dealing with other disciplinary issues. Among them:

- Correspondent Peter Ariz and I are hearing that freshmen receiver Sam Bruce is facing a potential one- or two-game suspension for brandishing a gun in a photo that resulted in Bruce withdrawing from St. Thomas

Aquinas in February, shortly after signing his letter of intent with UM.

Bruce used the photo of himself with a weapon during a dispute with a former Aquinas male student over Bruce's ex-girlfriend. A source said the photo ended up in the hands of the former student, who called police and St. Thomas. No charges were filed.

It's possible Richt could change his mind and decide not to suspend Bruce. But a UM source with direct knowledge said the university's mindset at this point is to suspend Bruce to start the season because there is an expectation of how UM players should represent themselves.

Bruce, rated by Rivals.com as the seventh best receiver and 47th best player in the 2016 class, enrolled at UM in late June.

- Defensive end Al-Quadin Muhammad, arguably the Hurricanes' best defensive player, remains under scrutiny as UM continues to investigate whether at least four football players violated NCAA rules in a matter involving a local car agency. As of Tuesday, Muhammad had not been cleared, and it was undetermined if he would face discipline.

A source said UM is not expected to bring back linebacker Juwon Young, who was suspended indefinitely last month after not being forthcoming with UM officials about the matter. UM also has investigated whether linebacker Jermaine Grace was involved.

UM's investigation has focused on whether the players received heavily discounted luxury cars in exchange for some future stake in their careers. Three sources told Ariz and me that the dealership is South Beach Exotic Rentals.

Asked this week whether his dealership had rented cars to any UM players, the company's owner, Juan Caballero, said: "I'm not aware of any of that. Maybe lower levels of the company have."

Asked if he has ever given UM players free cars to drive, he said: "We're not giving anything for free. Jay-Z paid when he rented a car. Justin Bieber paid."

Caballero said "no [UM] player is getting any sort of special treatment. I couldn't name one person on that team," adding that his company is "the biggest car rental on the beach."

A UM player said eyebrows were raised when Young drove to practice last season in an expensive car. According to a UM source, a former girlfriend informed UM about Young's involvement.

ACC teams typically bring one offensive player and one defensive player to the conference's media day, next week in Charlotte. But UM, cognizant of the car controversy, is taking punter Justin Vogel (along with quarterback Brad Kaaya) instead of Muhammad or Grace.

- Walton is not expected to miss any games. A day after Walton's attorney accused law enforcement of botching the

matter, city of Miami police chief Rodolfo Llanes released a statement defending his department's handling of the case.

"Mr. Walton was taken into custody based upon probable cause, which is the legal standard required to effect an arrest," the police said in a statement. "... Mr. Walton's eventual blood alcohol level was below the .08 threshold, however it should be noted that Mr. Walton is not of age to purchase or consume alcoholic beverages. The declination to file criminal charges as a function of prosecutorial discretion should not be used to presume wrongdoing on the part of the Miami Police Department or any of its officers."

### CHATTER

- Though the Heat has 15 players, Miami remains in conversations with point guard Beno Udrih, according to his agent. The Heat has left open the possibility of his return at the minimum, but he hasn't decided what to do.

- According to agent Joel Bell, center Willie Reed accepted a two-year deal at the minimum from the Heat, instead of an offer for more elsewhere because "he enjoyed his time with the Heat in Summer League last year and remembered how great the coaches are. He said [assistant coach] Juwan Howard showed him a couple things that helped him and he remembered that."

- Despite the fear that Ndamukong Suh's contract (which was restructured) would be an

albatross on Miami's cap, the Dolphins will be in pretty good shape next offseason.

If the cap rises from \$155 million to \$160 million, the Dolphins would have \$16 million in space, plus a large chunk of 2016 carryover space (\$17 million, according to the players' union) and the ability to clear out a lot more by cutting or restructuring Branden Albert (\$10.6 million cap hit in 2017), Mario Williams (\$10.5 million), Byron Maxwell (\$8.5 million), Earl Mitchell (\$4.5 million) and Isa Abdul-Quddus (\$5 million), among others. They also could restructure Mike Pouncey (\$8.9 million).

- The Marlins are one of only three teams that haven't signed their first-round pick (Alabama prep left-hander Braxton Garrett), and the MLB deadline for that is Friday. The Marlins have said they are optimistic they will strike a deal with Garrett's agent, Scott Boras.

- The Marlins (with limited available trade assets) continue efforts to acquire a starting pitcher from a group that includes Tampa's Jake Odorizzi, San Diego's Drew Pomeranz and potentially Oakland's Rich Hill, among others. If they cannot, their best hope for a competent fifth starter might be Jarred Cosart, who has allowed four runs in eight innings over two starts in Single A after missing a month with an oblique injury. Justin Nicolino, Jose Urena and Jeremy Guthrie are the other internal options.

## Ellis sets U.S. women's soccer team

There were no surprises on the U.S. women's Olympic roster, named by coach Jill Ellis on Tuesday.

The team includes 14 players from the 2015 Women's World Cup championship team, and rising stars Crystal Dunn — the National Women's Soccer League MVP — and teen phenom Mallory Pugh, who turned 18 in April.

"Building for the future certainly came into play," Ellis, a Palmetto Bay resident, said of her roster selections. "If I was going to bring new people in, they'd have a shot at a 2019 [World Cup] roster. And then if it was returning players, it was, 'Do I see them having a shot at the 2019 roster?' This is such a massive event, and a great experience for the new players."

The Americans are seeking a fourth consecutive Olympic gold medal and are attempting to become the first women's team to win the World Cup and Olympics back-to-back.

One of the only questions heading into Rio is

the fitness of midfielder Megan Rapinoe, who has not played since tearing an ACL last fall. She joined camp last week and performed well enough to keep her spot.

Other veterans on the squad include goalkeeper Hope Solo; midfielder Carli Lloyd; forward Alex Morgan; and Becky Sauerbrunn, Kelley O'Hara and Tobin Heath. Defender Ali Krieger made the team after missing the 2012 Olympics in London with a knee injury. World Cup forwards Sydney Leroux and Amy Rodriguez are pregnant and not playing. Abby Wambach, the all-time scoring leader, is one of four players who retired after the World Cup.

"The last few camps capped a nine-month evaluation process and the players certainly made it a real challenge to narrow the roster down to 18," Ellis said. "We've got a great blend of players with experience at the Olympic Games and in major events along with the youthful energy of some players who did not play in the Women's World Cup last summer."

Team USA is in Group

G with France, Colombia and New Zealand. Its first two matches are in Belo Horizonte, and it faces Colombia in Manaus, the Amazon city where the U.S. men's team played Portugal in the 2014 World Cup.

### VOLLEYBALL

Outside hitter Jordan Larson and setter Courtney Thompson were named to the U.S. women's volleyball roster for the upcoming Rio Olympics by coach Karch Kiraly.

They are joined by middles Foluke Akinradewo and Christa Dietzen as returnees from the team that won the silver medal at the 2012 London Games.

Newcomers on the 12-player roster include outside hitter Kim Hill and Kelsey Robinson, middle Rachael Adams, opposites Karsta Lowe and Kelly Murphy, setters Alisha Glass and Carli Lloyd and libero Kayla Banwarth.

The top-ranked U.S. team, which has won silver medals at the past two Olympics, opens the tournament on Aug. 6 against Puerto Rico.

### GOLF

Jordan Spieth said pulling out of the Olympics was the hardest decision he has ever made, and that it likely will haunt him as he's watching golfers compete for a gold medal in Rio de Janeiro for the first time in 112 years.

Spieth cited "health concerns" as his reason for withdrawing, though he said the Zika virus was only part of it. Asked what kept him out of the Olympics, the 22-year-old Texan would only say that it was personal and anyone in his shoes would have made the same choice.

"Why was it so hard? Because I'm a huge believer in Olympic golf," Spieth said Tuesday during a news conference in Troon, Scotland, that touched only briefly on his bid for the third leg of the career Grand Slam at the British Open. "This year I just had to try and weigh a risk that doesn't present itself every year."

"And just at the time that I had to make the decision, I just felt this was the right move for me. Not everybody's going to understand. Nobody's going to understand what it's like in my shoes."

## Pacquiao plans to return to the ring in November

Manny Pacquiao isn't ready to give up his night job just yet.

Pacquiao, who said before his last fight in April that he would retire, now plans to return to the ring in November against an opponent who has yet to be selected.

Promoter Bob Arum said Tuesday in Las Vegas that Pacquiao got permission to take a break from his new duties as a senator in the Philippines to take another fight. It will be held Nov. 5, likely in Las Vegas.

"He likes to fight, and he likes the attention," Arum said of Pacquiao's return.

Pacquiao looked impressive in his last fight in April, returning from a layoff to knock down Timothy Bradley on his way to a unanimous decision. After the fight he wavered on his previous plans to retire.

"If you ask me to come back I don't know," Pacquiao said. "I may be enjoying retired life. I'm not there yet so I just don't know."

Pacquiao, who was formerly a congressman in his native country, was elected to the Senate in May, and there were fears that increased duties would prevent him from fighting again.

But Arum said the head of the Senate told Pacquiao he was free to fight after the country's budget is settled on Oct. 15.

"He would train in the Philippines and leave on the 16th to come to the U.S., train for two weeks and then come to Vegas," Arum said. "The only issue is getting an arena for the fight."

Arum said he is talking with MGM Resorts about an arena to host the fight. He had reserved the Mandalay Bay arena for Oct. 15, but Pacquiao can't leave his Senate duties that early.

### ETC.

- **Cycling:** Michael Matthews profited from the work of his teammates to win the 10th stage of the Tour de France in a sprint finish after a long break-

away. The Australian rider edged world champion Peter Sagan and Edvald Boasson Hagen to claim his first stage win at cycling's biggest race. The stage took the riders from Escaldes-Engordany in Andorra on a 122-mile trek to Revel in the south of France.

Matthews was part of an early breakaway during the 14-mile climb to the Port d'Envalira, the highest climb of the Tour at 7,900 feet. Finishing 9 minutes 39 seconds behind in the main peloton, Chris Froome kept the yellow jersey. The two-time Tour champion has a 16-second overall lead over fellow Briton Adam Yates, with Irish rider Dan Martin in third place, 19 seconds behind.

- **NBA:** The Detroit Pistons bolstered their collection of big men, signing center Boban Marjanovic to a three-year, \$21 million contract. ... The Clippers signed free agent Marreese Speights, who played on Golden State's NBA championship team a year ago. ... The Memphis Grizzlies signed guard Andrew Harrison and center Deyonta Davis to multiyear contracts, waived guard Tony Wroten and announced the acquisition of guard Troy Daniels.

- **NHL:** The Arizona Coyotes signed captain Shane Doan to a one-year contract with a base salary of \$2.5 million. The total deal will be around \$5 million with a deferred signing bonus and deferred incentives for the NHL's longest-tenured captain. ... Defenseman Korbinian Holzer has agreed to a one-year, \$700,000 deal to return to the Anaheim Ducks.

- **Tennis:** Sixth-seeded Adrian Mannarino of France rallied past James Duckworth of Australia 6-7 (3-7), 7-6 (7-5), 7-6 (7-4) to advance to the second round of the Hall of Fame Tennis Championships in Newport, Rhode Island. Qualifier Frank Dancevic of Canada beat American Ryan Harrison 6-4, 6-4 on center court in a match that ended a few minutes after Mannarino's victory.
